Illnesses

Please do not send nuts in to school in any form. We have several children in school with life threatening nut allergies. Please also inform the school if your child has an infectious disease e.g chicken pox.

Medicines

All inhalers should be kept with children however, for your child's safety, we would be grateful if you would send in a spare to be held at the office. If your child needs any medicine to be administered during the school day, a form must be completed at the school office before we can help. Please do not send painkillers etc. to school in a schoolbag as this can pose a danger to other children.

Mobile phones

We would prefer that children do not bring mobile phones to school. However, if your child has a phone in school, please remind them that it must be switched off during the school day and should never be used to photograph or film anyone in school. If your child is travelling on school transport, please support us in discouraging them from using their phone on the bus at all.



Healthy eating



Children are encouraged to bring any uneaten food within packed lunches home, so that you can see what they have eaten. As P1-3 pupils are entitled to a free meal, if your child brings their own packed lunch to school, they are welcome to help themselves to soup, fruit, yoghurt etc.

Toileting

Your child will always be allowed to visit the toilet when needed however staff will also encourage children to ensure they go at break times in order to establish good habits and minimise disruption to learning. Please contact us if you have any concerns regarding toileting.

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Working Together

Thanks to those of you who managed along to our recent 'Meet the Teacher' event and thank you for such positive feedback. We continue to hold this event to provide an informal opportunity for parents/carers to say hello and see their child's class. We are aware that the mid-morning timing of this doesn't always suit. Improvement Priorities 16/17

We are working in line with the National Improvement Framework which highlights schools should have a focus on literacy and numeracy.

This session we plan to:-

- Continue to raise attainment in literacy through revising reading programmes and reviewing approaches to learning & teaching within writing.
- Continue to raise attainment in numeracy & maths by building on our recent successes.
- Introduce the next phase of French within P1-P5 as well as begin to introduce Spanish.
- Continue to raise the profile of learning and teaching in science.
- Develop new approaches to ICT, particularly with the re-location to our new school.
- Refresh our approaches

to Inter-disciplinary learning with a focus on Social Studies.

In addition we will take on board valued feedback from pupils, parents and other stakeholders to continually improve.
