Working Together

Anti-bullying

In last year's parental survey a small number of parents commented that as their child had not experienced bullying at the school, they did not know how we would deal with it. We then discussed this and our policy with the Parent Council and together we felt that our policy is comprehensive but our pupil voice could be clearer in this matter. We therefore invited our pupils to discuss this at our last 'Big Blether' and have shared their responses with them. Next, we will invite a group of pupils to compile a pupil friendly version of our policy.

School Improvements

During in-service, staff worked together to review our current reading programme to incorporate the school's introduction of NL Active Literacy approaches this year. We find that pupils are responding well to these approaches. Thank you to parents/carers who came along to our recent Literacy Information session ~ feedback was very positive and we will continue provide information on approaches used within school.
